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AARP & NORC Foresight 50+ Omnibus Survey: Generational Views


Interview Dates: 12/9/2021–12/13/2021

A nationally representative sample of 1,011 English-speaking adults, age 50 and over, conducted using the Foresight 50+ panel, a probability-based panel of NORC at the University of Chicago and AARP.

Of the 1,011 respondents, 58 completed the survey by phone and 952 via web.

This self-funded poll was conducted via Foresight 50+ during a monthly Omnibus survey that included 1,011 interviews with a nationally representative sample of adults age 50 and older (margin of error +/- 4.23 percentage points). Funded and operated by NORC at the University of Chicago, Foresight 50+ is a probability-based panel designed to represent the 50-and-older U.S. household population. During the initial panel recruitment phase, randomly selected U.S. households are sampled with a known, non-zero probability of selection from the NORC National Sample Frame or a secondary national address frame, both with over 97 percent coverage of all U.S. addresses. NORC contacts selected households using the U.S. Postal Service (USPS), email, telephone, or via field interviews (face to face). Households are screened for having at least one adult 50 or older. People with post office box-only addresses, addresses not listed in the USPS Delivery Sequence File, and those in newly constructed dwellings, are excluded from the sample. The panel also excludes some people who live in institutional settings, such as nursing facilities or nursing homes, depending on how addresses are listed for the facility.
